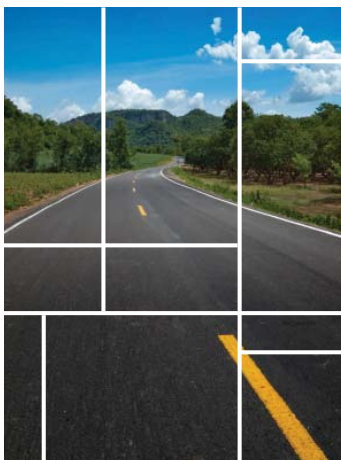

	Soil Rehabilitation Below Pavements Using Polyurethane Injection	Richard Hess, CST Stabilization Pavement integrity can be compromised by unstable subgrade issues. Injection of expanding polyurethane is often a viable option for stabilizing these problem areas and for lifting of settled pavement where needed.
Room C	Pavement Interlayers - History & Advancements	Julie Foreman, Tensar An innovative pavement interlayer, called GlasGrid TF, has recently been introduced that uses an integral 100% polymer tack film to eliminate the need for a traditional spray-applied tack coat. GlasGrid TF delivers a stronger bond that not only improves reflective crack resistance, but now also withstands overlay fatigue five times longer than an unreinforced overlay. During the presentation a history of pavement interlayers will be given and will conclude with an introduction to the GlasGrid TF system.
