A Word from the Director of Engineering

The Asphalt Pavement Alliance polled drivers across the United States asking what matters to them. A few key findings included:

Common Roadway Issues, Ranked Lowest in the Past Year

Potholes/Deteriorating Pavement – 33%

Roadside Puddles – 33%

Poor Drainage – 41%

Roadway Joints – 46%

Blots in the Pavement – 58%

Uneven Surfaces – 71%

They most often ranked ahead their Maintenance Preferences:

Leave certain repairs during off peak hours (38%) vs. Call it down for repair (34%).

Reserve for last-minute delays (33%) vs. less overall no delays (27%).

Reschedule every 12-18 yrs. (30%) vs. reschedule every 12-18 yrs. & replace every 30-35 yrs. (13%).

When asked about priorities when building/fixing roads, their top response (33%) ranked roads that had seen regular maintenance.

The result? Drivers don't necessarily pay attention to which pavement type they are driving on. However, they most value that hard and stable surface that allows a smooth ride. Asphalt is the answer.

- The positive approach of the county to enhance road technology and program improvements.



Spotlight on SMA.

Stone matrix asphalt (SMA) is a geograded HMA that is designed to maximize rutting resistance and durability by using a structured basis of stone-matrix control. Rut resistance relies on aggregate proportion rather than asphalt binder proportion. Therefore, SMA is almost exclusively used for medium volumes on high volume roads. Local agencies have been using SMA for their arterial paving programs and demonstrating a 10% increase in service life of the paving. The City of Aurora and the City of Lakewood have established SMA programs and other agencies are starting to implement them (Superior, Englewood and Douglas County). Do you have a question for ASPHALT MAN?



QUESTION: Does APA have test positions for paving IAH thicknesses?

ANSWER: There are industry standards on minimum paving thicknesses based on nominal maximum aggregate sizes. These standards are incorporated into the CDOT IAH Thickness Standards and the CDOT Pavement Design Manual (Section 3.6.2) includes guidance on both minimum and maximum IAH thickness as it pertains to long-term pavement performance.

Required Minimum Thickness of Pavement Layer

Corporation of a hot mix asphalt pavement during its construction is the single most important factor that affects the ultimate performance of the pavement. Achieving adequate compaction increases pavement performance by decreasing rutting, reducing damage due to moisture and oxidation, and increasing the stability of the mix. Factors affecting the mixing rate of the mix include the layer thickness, the temperature of the mix when placed, ambient temperature, temperature of the mixes, and wind conditions. Layer thickness is the single most important variation in the mixing rate of an asphalt mix, especially for hot mix. This is especially true in cool weather because thin layers of asphalt mix have less capacity to retain heat than thicker layers of pavement. The thicker layers of asphalt mix help to regulate the temperature at a much lower level than increasing the free available for compaction. Because of the increased difficulty in achieving density and the importance of achieving compaction, a minimum layer thickness for construction is law.
