

Colorado governor unveils “safer-at-home” period after stay-at-home order ends Sunday April 26. Gov. Jared Polis on Monday revealed what life may be like in Colorado starting next week, when his statewide stay-at-home order expires, preparing the public for a “marathon” of restrictions likely to last for months in order to prevent the new coronavirus from spreading out of control. Polis is calling this [new 3 phase plan](#) Colorado’s “safer-at-home” period. *When the stay-at-home order [ends April 26](#), on Sunday, the main difference will be that Coloradans will be urged, rather than ordered, to stay in.* Detailed guidance on how the state will begin to reopen is expected to be released in the coming days. Polis on Monday only described the plan in broad strokes. The governor’s staff also cautioned that his preview Monday of what things will look like moving forward could change.
