

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






2020 Local Agency Pavement Condition and Funding

Summary Data Available



CAPA has published the 2020 Local Agency Summary Pavement Condition Report and it is available to download from the CAPA website.

Across the state there are 88,000 lane miles of asphalt and local agencies are responsible for funding and maintaining 74% of that network (over 65,000 lane miles). Ninety agencies have provided street funding and condition data in the 2020 edition.

Agency feedback has been very responsive "Thanks for taking the time to compile all of this information, it is very useful"... "Thanks for sharing other agencies responses so we can see where we are"... "Thank you for continuing to put this together, it is a great tool to share with our Elected Officials."



Of the agencies that reported both 2019 and 2020 data, 54% reported an increase in their streets budget (+\$25M) and 46% reported a decrease (-\$22.4M). Budget data also indicates that Capital Improvement Project spending is up 6%, Mill & Overlay programs have increased +7% and Maintenance Programs have increased stayed level. Agencies are reporting that over \$300M has been budgeted for 2020 Annual Street Improvement Programs with an additional \$310M in Capital Projects...that's a total of over \$610M being spent by Local Agencies this year on streets and infrastructure across Colorado. 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CATEGORY - CDOT Smoothness Category I



CDOT recognizes the smoothest paving project in each of their four roadway smoothness specification categories and are based on the project's MRI smoothness profile. Category I is for Urban Reconstruction with or without curb and gutter and one-layer overlays over an intermediate treatment. The work consisted primarily of placing 17.6 miles of new asphalt pavement over existing pavement.

CATEGORY - CDOT Smoothness Category II

CDOT recognizes the smoothest paving project in each of their four roadway smoothness specification categories and are based on the project's MRI smoothness profile. Category II is for New construction with or without curb and gutter construction of more than one layer. This winning project is located along US 160 north of Towac in Montezuma County in CDOT Region 5.



CDOT recognizes the smoothest paving project in each of their four roadway smoothness specification categories and are based on the project's MRI smoothness profile. Category III is for only one layer of pavement being placed without an intermediate treatment. The project consisted of 23 miles of 2-inch hot in-place recycling with a 1.5-inch new asphalt overlay.

CATEGORY - CDOT Smoothness Category IV

Category IV is for roadway improvement where smoothness must be improved or maintained without incentive payment. This \$3.5M project consisted of placing over 38,000 tons of mix as part of Larimer County's 2019 Resurfacing Program.



This project included complete reconstruction of Owl Canyon Road with full depth reclamation using chemical stabilization with fly ash and seven inches of new asphalt pavement.



Twenty years later, that 3-mile section is still performing well with only minimal maintenance having been performed.

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







Women of Asphalt - Colorado Branch
